

DEVELOPMENT & FRIENDSHIP PLAN FOR IFCR TOUR TO
TASMANIA

SATURDAY 12 TO SUNDAY 20 FEBRUARY 2011

The Tour's purpose is to promote and recruit players and supporters to IFCR in Tasmania and to welcome this great sporting State into the known joys of this Worldwide Cricketing Organisation..

Saturday 12th-- Arrive Devonport for team gathering at Devonport Hotel.

Sunday 13th—Cabs to Devonport match against North West Team with as many Rotarians as can be arranged, balance to be made up from similarly aged local players.

Fellowship dinner or function after game to be arranged. Home hosting by local Rotarians if possible.

Monday 14th—Depart Devonport to Launceston by coach. Game similar as for match above.

Fellowship Dinner after game to be arranged.
Again local home hosting if possible.

Tuesday 15th—Depart Launceston for Scottsdale with sightseeing around Launceston and Scottsdale area taking in the full day.

Welcome function at Scottsdale in evening.

Home Hosting if possible.

As the IFCR team played against the Scottsdale Forresters in October 2009 at the Hume and Hovell Cricket Ground, Strath Creek, this is to be a return match, again with as many local Rotarians as possible in one or both of the teams.

This match had its genesis from the disastrous Black Saturday bushfires that swept through Victoria on February 7 2009 and was arranged by the Rotary Clubs of Scottsdale and Yea to celebrate the amazing levels of support that came from the people of Tasmania, but especially the Rotary Club of Scottsdale.

A permanent bond of Rotary fellowship exists between the two Clubs.

At the same time as the cricket match in November a group of Scottsdale golfers made the trip to Yea as well and played the first golf game back on the destroyed Marysville Golf Club against Yea Rotarians. Scottsdale were successful in both encounters.

It is to be hoped that a group of Yea Club golfers and supporters will make the trip to Scottsdale to coincide with the cricket celebrations.

This natural disaster has directly given rise to the ideal of establishing IFCR in Tasmania, where, hitherto there was only one member. Now that number is 13 and can be expected to grow as a result of this Friendship Tour.

Wednesday 16th—Cricket and golf in Scottsdale. Again home hosting if possible and farewell dinner/function after games.

Thursday 17th—Depart Scottsdale for Hobart sightseeing along the way. Welcome Dinner in Hobart and again home hosting if possible.

Friday 18th—Match against local Rotarians/others with Social function in evening.

Saturday 19th—Free day in Hobart with last night in a Hobart Hotel with wind up dinner there.

Sunday 20th—Depart Hobart for home.
